FPC Chamber Chorale & Metropolis Baroque Chamber Orchestra of Chicago

This October marks the 500<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Protestant Reformation. FPC is joining in the worldwide celebration by hosting a special joint concert as part of the QCSO's 2017-2018 Signature Series. FPS's auditioned Chamber Chorale joins with the Metropolis Baroque Chamber Orchestra of Chicago to present two Reformation cantatas by arguably the most important Lutheran composer in history, Johann Sebastian Bach. This special evening of early music includes

performances of Bach's BWV 79 ("Gott der Herr ist Sonn und Schild") and BWV 80 ("Ein feste Burg ist unser Gott"), as well as the famous Double Violin Concerto. The Metropolis Baroque Chamber Orchestra is one of Chicago's preeminent early music ensembles, specializing in instrumental and operatic repertoires of the Italian and German Baroque. Under the artistic direction of cellist Craig Trompeter, the musicians of Metropolis Baroque have recently been featured in the Valletta International Baroque Festival in Malta. **October 8 - Voices of Muslim Women in the U.S. South**  
Kent Schroder facilitates *Voices of Muslim Women in the U.S. South* Iowa Religious Media Services (IRMA) documentary. This class explores the Muslim culture through the lens of five University of Alabama Muslim students. How do they define a space for self-expression and negotiate their identities in a predominately Christian society that has unflattering views about Islam and Muslims?



**October 15 - Connecting with Buddhism**  
CONNECT with Dr. Jacob M. Romaniello of Augustana College. Dr. Romaniello, who taught for eleven years in Thailand and China, will share his expertise in Buddhism. He will discuss Buddhism's history, doctrines, the Rohingya issue, and how mindfulness-meditation can help a Christian.
