An initial deposit of \$500



(refundable until September, 2017) is required. We have launched an ambitious fundraising plan with the goal of reducing the cost of the trip. We want this to be a congregation-wide project: some will travel, some will help raise funds, some may donate items to help the refugees, and many will pray. ### 46<sup>th</sup> Annual CROP Hunger Walk - Sunday, October 1, 2:00 PM

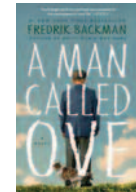
