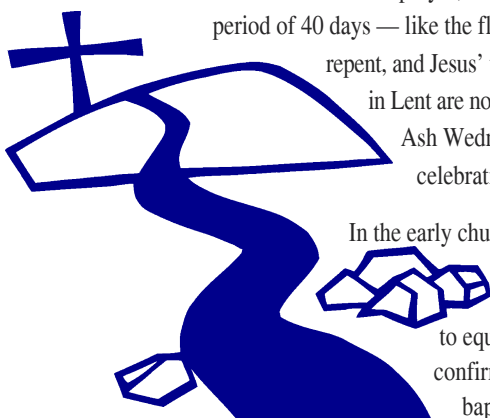


The Season of Lent is a time of prayer, fasting and self-examination in preparation for the celebration of the resurrection of the Lord at Easter. It is a period of 40 days — like the flood of Genesis, Moses' sojourn at Mount Sinai, Elijah's journey to Mount Horeb, Jonah's call to Ninevah to repent, and Jesus' time of testing in the wilderness. (The Sundays in Lent are not counted in this reckoning of the time between Ash Wednesday and Easter, as every Lord's Day is a celebration of the resurrection of Jesus Christ.)



In the early church, Lent was a time of preparation for the celebration of baptism at the Easter Vigil. In many communities of faith it remains a time to equip and nurture candidates for baptism and confirmation and to reflect deeply on the theme of baptismal discipleship. *- pcusa website*

Ash Wednesday, February 22 Worship Services at 12:00 Noon and 7:00 PM

Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of our Lenten journey to remembering God's love for us in Jesus Christ. The season of Lent is a time to prepare for the celebration of redemption through Jesus' life, death, and resurrection. We begin this holy season by acknowledging our sin and our need for repentance while also receiving the forgiveness of our sin by the grace of God. Lent is marked by self-examination and penitence, by prayer and fasting, by practicing works of love, and by reading and reflecting on God's holy Word.



Lenten Devotions for sharing and reflection

Psalm 34, 146, 25, 91 Jeremiah 15:10-21 Philippians 3:15-21 John 12:20-26

When I was much younger, I used to try to be like the cool kids. I talked, dressed, and acted the way I did, partly because of the influence of those I wanted to be like. That never really worked out for me. To be honest, I still talk, dress, and act the way I do, partly because of the influence of those I want to be like. Yes, we talk about peer pressure among teenagers as if it doesn't apply to adults as well. But, that's not true. The only hope is that with more life experience our choice in role models might be more discerning. These scriptures challenge us to choose our role models wisely.

In Philippians, Paul encourages the church to "join in imitating me, and observe those who live according to the example you have in us." He goes on to warn about following the "enemies of the cross of Christ." Psalm 146:3 says, "Do not put your trust in princes, in mortals, in whom there is no help." In John 12:26, Jesus says, "Whoever serves me will follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be also."

Annual Congregational Meeting - Sunday, February 26, 10:00 AM

Each year, in February, the church sets aside time for the Annual Congregational Meeting and encourages every member to attend. Typically, an annual meeting may consider such business as electing officers, hearing reports from the Session or selected committees of Session, a report from the Board of Deacons and other organizations of the church, and transacting any other business as is appropriate.

Per Capita - \$31.63 per member

Each January, First Church is assessed a per capita contribution by the Presbytery. This year it is \$31.63 per member. A member is anyone who has been confirmed or has been welcomed into the congregation by confession of faith, letter of transfer from another congregation, or upon reaffirmation of faith.



Please use a special Per Capita envelope from the pew racks on a Sunday morning and drop your clearly labeled contribution into the offering plate, or bring it to the church office. You will receive credit on your giving statement.

Church Membership Contact Information Requested by the General Assembly Mission Council

The PCUSA (Presbyterian Churches of the USA) has requested church membership information from First Presbyterian Church of Davenport, Iowa, to allow the General Assembly Mission Council (GAMC) to contact church members directly regarding Presbyterian mission and ministry on an ongoing basis.

However, our church Session is providing church members an opt-out time period to notify the church office if they do not want their contact information provided to the GAMC.

The Annual Fundraiser for the Board of Deacons is scheduled for the last two Sundays in February. Guys in Ties provide a fast-paced and hilarious show. Interaction with audience members provides added entertainment and humor to make the performance unique and unforgettable. Tickets will be sold between services at the Deacons' Corner in Fellowship Hall every Sunday in February and at the door, or may be purchased in the church office, Monday-Friday, 8:30 AM - 4:30 PM. First Presbyterian Church Heritage Committee and Archives Room

For the past year, led by Linda Meadors, First Presbyterian Church's Heritage Committee has been working enthusiastically to gather and organize the many archives and artifacts from our nearly-175-year history. This committee has been active for many years, but with some of the changes in the building in recent years, there is a focused drive to complete the bulk of our work in time for our 175th anniversary in 2014.

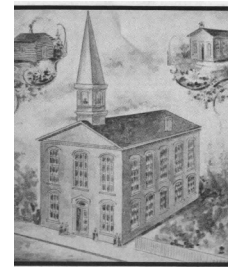
Until we physically opened file boxes, unwrapped packages, and snooped into some dark dingy spaces in the church building, no one person knew the depth of what we have. And, with every meeting of the committee, we discover more treasures. Some of these gems include candle sticks, offering pouches, membership records, Session/Deacons meeting minutes, photographs, paintings, building drawings, an 1838 coin, church directories, and newsletters a fascinating gavel that was used by the moderator of our synod and was constructed of laminated wood from all of our previous church buildings in Davenport since 1838 and much, much more.

We have been sorting and arranging in the third floor room where the artifacts will be permanently stored. Much of what we have is in the form of paper (8 ½ x 11 inches in size). And some is bulky.

Church member LaWanda Roudebush is a member of the committee. As the director of the Davenport Public

Library, she has offered to scan, copy, photograph, and digitize the important items in our collection, which will give us access by paper and computer images. Beyond this, she has offered to store the pertinent original documents in the Richardson-Sloane Special Collections Center at the downtown library (a climate controlled secure space). The church then will have copies for our files. This takes the edge off of the possibility of damage to the precious originals.

Our plan is to purchase archival quality file cabinets, storage cabinets, and display cases for storage and access of the archives. There will also be workspaces with computers for congregation members/former members/genealogists to do research. The cost of this project is anticipated to be in the \$30,000 to \$35,000 range. We are pursuing an Iowa grant which could pay for as much as two-thirds of the costs. The Session of FPC would like to know if the congregation believes this to be a project worthy of their endorsement. This is your opportunity to share your opinions and support. Please respond by February 15. If you would be willing to make a contribution towards this project, contact the church's Finance Manager, Shannon Gruhlke, (gruhlke@fpcdavenport.org or 563-326-1691, ext. 219). The Session will review this proposal and consider the congregation's willingness to support this project at the next Session meeting on February 20.
