

A Letter from Pastor Mark and Pastor Katie

God's beloved people:

Words continue to escape us as we try to describe our collective outrage over the atrocity of what happened to Mr. Floyd in Minneapolis.

It demonstrated that the ugliness of racism still is alive in our nation, and must be addressed by all people of goodwill and faith. Like all forms of sin, racism has a nasty habit of being ubiquitous, affects all of us, and continually needs to be called out and overcome by all of us.

It was an instance of an abuse of power, that happens in all sectors of life, that must not be tolerated. Changes must happen so moments like this do not continue. Many military and civilian servants of our nation are also disgusted and outraged at the inexcusable abuse of power that was on display. We rightly expect accountability and justice to be had, in this instance, as in all.

It has led to peaceful demonstrations calling out again for dialogue and constructive change across all segments of our society, change that is needed more than ever. It has also led to ugly destruction and violence, and those responsible are to be held accountable.

So what can we do as a community of faith?

We can come together as a community! Pastors Mark and Katie have begun conversations with Pastor Rogers Kirk of Third Missionary Baptist Church about how both of our communities can come together to share worship, fellowship, and find ways to express common support and voice for our community in these times. We believe that this is an opportune time to revive a previous pulpit exchange relationship both congregations enjoyed. Stay tuned for further developments.

We can act! Take time to donate to organizations which are rebuilding communities and working to stop violence. Speak up for justice. Learn about the history of racism and violence, so we can work for a better future. If you're not sure where to start, ask Pastor Katie for resources, which the ACE Committee is working on.

We can pray! Let us pray for:

- •Our president, Congress, governor, state legislatures, and all in elected leadership for wisdom in their leadership and decisions.
- •All who wear the uniforms of our nation, whether civilian or military.
- •All congregations, faith-based organizations, and human service organizations to come together and find practical and life-giving solutions to the divisions and oppression, racial and otherwise that those in our community experience, especially people of color and all who are disenfranchised, and that impact all of us.
- •That each of us, equipped by God's Word, filled by God's ever-active presence, become part of the change we want to see happen in our nation and our communities.
- •For the officers involved in that abuse of power, the family of George Floyd and the families of these officers, and for all involved in the investigation and responsible for the exercise of justice.
- •For all who have experienced damage because of the riots and for those who caused the damage.
- •For all who march for peace that they become agents of peace in our communities.

We continue to be agents and witnesses to God's transformative word in Jesus Christ that transforms us and our hearts. Because in the end, this is the only solution that lead us to action as Christians. It is the only solution that will solve the problem of human sin and brokenness that manifests itself in moments like these. It is the one unique gift that God has entrusted to the church, in all her expressions, to offer to our world, that is deeply broken by all expressions of sin manifest before us, and needs wholeness and resurrection.

As Dr. Martin Luther King says: "Darkness cannot drive out darkness. Only light can do that. Hate cannot drive out hate. Only love can do that."

As the scriptures say in 1 John 2: 9-11: Whoever says, "I am in the light," while hating a brother or sister, is still in the darkness. Whoever loves a brother or sister lives in the light, and in such a person there is no cause for stumbling. But whoever hates another believer is in the darkness, walks in the darkness, and does not know the way to go, because the darkness has brought on blindness.

And: John 13:34-35 I give you a new commandment, that you love one another. Just as I have loved you, you also should love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you have love for one another."

May God's Shalom abound in our world today!
