



The Music Department Announces the 29th Season of FPCs Performing Arts Series

The music department at First Presbyterian Church is pleased to announce the twenty-ninth season of The Performing Arts Series, albeit with some important temporary changes as we continue to navigate how the ongoing COVID-19 pandemic is affecting the arts.

Our plan is to offer a half-season that will begin mid-March and last until mid-May. Presenting such a season provides an opportunity to give back to the church, without which there would be no Performing Arts Series.
