

Dear Friends.

As your Associate Pastor, I've worked with you through tremendous changes in our church. We've started new programs, gotten creative during COVID restrictions, and served our community. These years have helped me learn and change as a pastor quite a bit. After much prayer and consideration, I have accepted a position as a solo pastor at Milan Presbyterian Church. I believe this larger leadership role will be a better fit for my skills.

These past few years have brought tremendous upheaval to our church, our nation, and in my own life. Together, we've worked through staff transitions and all the changes COVID brought. You've shepherded me through pregnancy loss, Helen's birth, and my mother's death. You've helped me move, brought me meals, cracked jokes, and recommended good coffee shops. I am grateful for the ways we have been church together, and know you will be just as compassionate to your next pastors, just like you are to each other.

I want to make sure that my transition out of leadership here is as smooth as possible. I will begin serving at Milan on March 1st, and am currently planning for February 14th to be my last Sunday here. If you have questions about my new call, the transition process, or just want to talk, please contact me! When I leave ministry here at First Pres, there will have to be some space - I want to make sure that your pastors can jump in and start serving without interference, and that I can completely focus on the congregation in Milan. But we'll still be living in the Quad Cities; even when I'm not your pastor, I'll still be your neighbor.

I am extremely grateful for the kindness, patience, and camaraderie you have shown me. Thank you for serving God with me. May God continue to bless and keep all of you as First Pres plans for its future. In Christ,
