- Nancy Chapman and John Gere updated the Session on the stained-glass window restoration project. They provided a brief history of restoration work completed, information on additional work that is needed, and the potential funding sources for that work, including the status of grant proposals.
- Approved a motion from the Pandemic Task Force that will allow for the start of outdoor Sunday worship and communion as early as March when weather allows.
- Approved a motion from the Personnel Committee for Sarah Greim and Paula Hartmann to assume responsibilities in Christian Education for the short-term.
- Received an e-mail from the Synod Administrative Review Committee that their final report is should be provided to the Session and the Presbytery of East Iowa on March 1, 2021.
- Appreciation was given to Rev. Dr. Pam Saturnia, FPC Muscatine, who has been our Moderator since September 2020. This was her last Session meeting with us. Rev. Kathy Stoner-Lasala will assume that duty in March.
