Sculpted with the rest of the edifice between 1220 and 1240 by an unknown artisan as a quatrefoil on the western wall of the building, this work is a depiction of Christian Fortitude. "Therefore take up the whole armor of God, so that you may be able to withstand on that evil day, and having done everything, to stand firm." - Ephesians 6:13.






Ask for God's help with the things that make our life hard, things that upset us, and things that make it hard to do what's right.
