Justice and peace will kiss each other.


Faithfulness will spring up from the earth;





Reconciliation Process Begins

The Synod of Lakes and Prairies directed our congregation and the Presbytery of East Iowa to engage in a reconciliation process.

The Rev. Dr. Beth McCaw has been engaged to facilitate our work. Beth is an ordained minister in the Presbyterian Church (USA). She serves as the Executive Presbyter of Glacier Presbytery in Montana; and she teaches on the faculty of the University of Dubuque Theological Seminary.

Beth began her work in July by learning about the events of the last few years and by meeting with the first of many individuals.

Beth's work is focused on helping us to move forward as a congregation.

We are pleased to invite you to join a Presbytery-wide learning time with Effi Latsoudi, PC(USA) International Peacemaker.

Latsoudi is a psychologist and founding member and coordinator of the Pikpa Solidarity Cap in Lesvos, Greece, the first open, independent, welcoming shelter for refugees fleeing to Greece primarily from Africa and the Middle East.

More than 30,000 vulnerable refugees and victims of sea tragedies have been supported by Pikpa.

In the last decade, Effi has been at the forefront of helping and welcoming refugees, providing for the shelter, needs and in some cases proper funerals of migrants, even going to lengths to identify them and inform their relatives.

The most tragic day for
Latsoudi was October 28,
2015, when more than 70
migrants drowned just off the
coast of Lesvos.

This episode left a profound mark upon her humanitarian experience.
