



For in the one Spirit we were all baptized into one body—Jews or Greeks, slaves or free—and we were all made to drink of one Spirit. Indeed, the body does not consist of one member but of many. If the foot were to say, 'Because I am not a hand, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. And if the ear were to say, 'Because I am not an eye, I do not belong to the body', that would not make it any less a part of the body. If the whole body were an eye, where would the hearing be? 



- Thanks were given and blessings offered for Elders Dan Ellard, Jeffrey Gomez, Pete Madden and Don Wood, who have completed their active service on the Session.
- Received a report from the Finance Committee that we will end the year with a
 positive balance (income over expenses) due to a few estate gifts and lower
 than budgeted compensation expenses.
- A requested update on the FPC Response to the Synod Administrative
 Committee recommendations was submitted to Synod on December 14, 2021.
- The Reconciliation Circles offered by Rev. Dr. Beth McCaw have been completed.
- The Wedding Coordinator position at the church was eliminated as it duplicated much of what the wedding officiant must do.
- Adopted a formal policy for conducting electronic voting on Session motions between stated meetings, if necessary.
