

Respond to God's Word

Reaffirmation of the Baptismal Covenant

Presentation Ruling Elder Sarah Greim and Deacon Al Frohlich

On behalf of the Session, I present our 2022 Confirmation Class to reaffirm the baptismal covenant into which they were baptized. They now desire to profess publicly their faith and to assume greater responsibility in the life of the church, and God's mission in the world.

We rejoice that you now desire to declare your faith and to share with us in our common ministry. In your baptism you were joined to Christ and made members of his church. In the community of the people of God, you have learned of God's purpose for you and for all creation. You have been nurtured at the table of our Lord and called to witness to the gospel of Jesus Christ.

Hear these words from Holy Scripture:

1 Peter 2:9

"You are chosen, a royal priesthood, a holy nation, God's own people, in order that you may proclaim the mighty acts of the One who called you out of the shadows into God's marvelous light."

Profession of Faith

Now, as you publicly declare your faith, I ask you to reject sin, to profess your faith in Christ Jesus, and to confess the faith of the church, the faith in which you were baptized.

Trusting in the gracious mercy of God, do you turn from the ways of sin and renounce evil and its power in the world?

I do.

Do you trust in Jesus Christ as your Lord and Savior? **I do.**

Will you be Christ's faithful disciple, obeying his word and showing his love? I will.

Our Confirmation Class has stepped into the living waters of the stream of believers that has been flowing for more than 200 years. With the whole church, let us confess our faith using both the ancient Apostles' creed and the brand new creed offered by this Confirmation Class:

I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

Our faith is a journey we have only just begun.


*What is a Liturgist?
