
# We are a Matthew 25 church







# From the White House Faith-Based Partnerships Office: Free 988 Suicide and Crisis Lifeline is Live!

988 is the new phone number for crisis care that Americans can use to reach trained counselors who can help if they are experiencing suicidal, substance use or other mental health crises. Anyone in a U.S. state, territory, or tribe who needs suicide or mental health-related crisis support, or who has a loved one in crisis, can connect with a trained counselor by calling 988 (multiple languages), texting (English only) 988 or chatting at Lifeline Chat: Lifeline (988lifeline.org)

Lifeline responds 24/7 to calls (multiple languages), chats, or texts (English only) from anyone who needs mental health-related or suicide crisis support and connects them with trained crisis counselors. The support and service received from the crisis counselors is provided at no charge to those who use the service; however, standard data rates from telecommunication mobile carriers may apply to those who text to the Lifeline.

#### What are Small Groups?

A Small Group (minimum of three, maximum of 12 people) shares "our spiritual journeys together, offering time to explore, study, pray and care for one another." (Envisioning 2020 Report to the Session, p. 10)

#### What does a Small Group do?

A Small Group may form for "a defined task over a specified time period such as a book study" or missional engagement, or for an "open-ended time for topics such as ongoing parenting discussions," long-term missional partnership or Bible study.

#### Why a Small Group?

Often larger groups tend to lose people in translation. However, smaller groups of our peers allow us to stop when needed, ask questions, converse amongst ourselves and hold one another accountable. We can add a little fun by naming our group, finding different places to meet, and just personalizing our group to make it our own.

#### Already Have a Small Group?

Several groups in our congregation function already as Small Groups.

Examples could be the Bible Basics 201 group or the Women of Hope Horizons Study group. Both groups are of the second Small Group type, an "open-ended time" without a stated closing date.


