the beauty of creation around and above us.



Candidating Sunday is November 6, 2022!

Following a comprehensive search and review of prospective pastoral candidates to lead First Presbyterian Church of Davenport into the 21st Century, our Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has unanimously recommended a candidate for consideration by the congregation. The candidate and his terms of call to our church will be presented on Sunday, November 6th. We strongly encourage all members of First Church to attend worship that day and participate in the candidate confirmation process.

The PNC started meeting at the beginning of 2021 and met weekly via Zoom, participating in weekly meetings from home, hotels, campsites and at least three different continents!

The dozen volunteers were put to work reviewing over forty different applicants for the position of pastor/head-of-staff for FPC. Candidates from both the US and UK were considered and several interviews were conducted via Zoom with prospective pastors. In August, three candidates were brought to the community to learn more about First Church and the Quad Cities, and to meet with the PNC in-person for a final series of interviews.

The candidate recommended by the PNC has tremendous people skills, is spiritually grounded, and has a great sense of humor (more on that when he introduces himself to the congregation during worship on Sunday, November 6th).

We hope you'll join us in welcoming and celebration on November 6th.

Mission Study is Available!

The FPC Mission Study entitled "At the Crossroads" is now available for members to read on the church website.

The document was created by the Pastor Nominating Committee to tell the story of our congregation — past, present and future -- for pastoral candidates.

Its message, regarding the need to revitalize the life of First Church, is also directed toward the membership as we seek to partner with a new leader to achieve that goal.

The PNC encourages you to thoughtfully review the study and consider how you might impact the future story of First Presbyterian Church.

- Automatic Bank Payments (ACH) and Credit Card Payments This option allows funds to be electronically

- Required Minimum Distributions (RMD) This option allows a donor who is at least 72 years young to direct their RMD distribution from their IRA, beneficiary IRA, or other qualified retirement plan directly to a charitable organization. This option may provide a tax benefit to the donor. Please discuss with your financial/tax advisor to determine if this option is available and right for you. When directing your required minimum distribution to FPC, please notify the Finance Office to receive up-to-date instructions and to ensure you receive full contribution credit.
- Qualified Charitable Distributions (QCD) This option allows a donor who is at least 70 ½ years young to donate to a charitable organization through a direct a distribution from their IRA, beneficiary IRA, or other qualified retirement plan that may provide a tax benefit to the donor. Please discuss with your financial/tax advisor to determine if this option is available and right for you. Also, please notify the Finance Office to receive up-to-date instructions on how to process your qualified charitable distribution to FPC and to ensure you receive full contribution credit.
- Gifting Stock Please discuss with your financial/tax advisor to determine if this option is available and right for you. When gifting stock to the church, please contact the Finance Office prior to the donation to receive upto-date instructions on how to process your stock donation to FPC and to ensure you receive full contribution credit. Please provide the following information prior to the estimated donation date:
 - Number of Shares Transferred
 - 2. Company or Stock Symbol
 - 3. Estimated Date of Transfer
 - 4. Indicate how you would like this applied (ex: pledge, special donation, etc.)
