

### **Donations for Music & Arts Academy, SBC Rock Island**

Over the summer, the Worship & Music Committee proposed to Session a way to reconcile the fact that our predominantly white Sanctuary Choir has historically drawn heavily from rich repertoire of slavery-era spirituals. There is nothing wrong with this practice; music from that tradition challenges our musical abilities and stylistic comforts, enriches our understanding of theology and culture, and can be downright fun to sing! But we also acknowledge that unlike when we perform music by white composers, we will never know the names of the people who wrote the music or text of these spirituals, nor those who first offered their voices to present these songs in worship; we acknowledge that the money we pay to purchase this music will never reach the descendants of those musically-talented and spirit-filled enslaved people, and instead benefit contemporary publishing companies; we acknowledge that this is a vestige of an oppressive system. And while we cannot fix that system, we humbly and happily join with a growing consortium of church choirs who have initiated the practice of "reparations payments" when we sing this great music.

The Worship & Music Committee has selected a wonderful organization that does great work in the Quad Cities to be a beneficiary of our donations today, and we ask you to give generously. The Music & Arts Academy of Second Baptist Church in Rock Island, founded in 2007, "is a non-profit, community-based institution dedicated to providing students of all ages with high-quality, affordable instruction in music and performing arts. We also offer a meal in between lessons and winter clothing (coats, hats, gloves, boots, etc.). With these programs, the Academy seeks to transform lives by providing the tools necessary to promote self-confidence and discipline needed to succeed in life, as well as the life-long joy of making music!"

### **Candidating Sunday is November 6, 2022!**

Following a comprehensive search and review of prospective pastoral candidates to lead First Presbyterian Church of Davenport into the 21st Century, our Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has unanimously recommended a candidate for consideration by the congregation. The candidate and his terms of call to our church will be presented on Sunday, November 6th. We strongly encourage all members of First Church to attend worship that day and participate in the candidate confirmation process.

The PNC started meeting at the beginning of 2021 and met weekly via Zoom, participating in weekly meetings from home, hotels, campsites and at least three different continents!

The dozen volunteers were put to work reviewing over forty different applicants for the position of pastor/head-of-staff for FPC. Candidates from both the US and UK were considered and several interviews were conducted via Zoom with prospective pastors. In August, three candidates were brought to the community to learn more about First Church and the Quad Cities, and to meet with the PNC in-person for a final series of interviews.

The candidate recommended by the PNC has tremendous people skills, is spiritually grounded, and has a great sense of humor (more on that when he introduces himself to the congregation during worship on Sunday, November 6th).

We hope you'll join us in welcoming and celebration on November 6th.
