Welcome to First Presbyterian Church of Davenport, a church where EVERYONE is welcome. On behalf of the entire First Pres family, we want you to know that we are so glad you're here. We are a proud congregation of the Presbyterian Church (USA), where We Choose WELCOME!

We welcome followers of Jesus who are solid in their faith, and we welcome questioning believers seeking deeper meaning in their life. We welcome those who come from different faith backgrounds, such as Methodists, Lutherans, and Catholics, and those with no faith background at all; for we are all one in Christ Jesus. No matter where you are on your journey of faith, you are welcome here!

We hope you experience the warmth and friendliness of our congregation. It is a place that long-term members have described as their spiritual home for generations. It is also a place where people newer to our community of faith have found a safe and sacred space for themselves and their families.

Nursery care is available during the worship service for children (birth through age 4). The nursery is staffed by trained and background-checked caregivers from 8:45 AM to 12:15 PM. The nursery is on the third floor of the Christian Education (CE) building. Ask a worship host if you need assistance locating this space.

Kirkwood Choir is offered during the service, after the Children's Message, for all children ages five through sixth grade. Kirkwood Choir provides music for worship monthly throughout the program year.

MusikGarten, a program for parents/caregivers and young children (birth through age 4), is provided after the service in room #310 of the CE building. MusikGarten is our unique program that allows participation in a fun, energetic environment while instilling a love and understanding of music in young children.

Sunday school for children (preschool through grade six) and adults is offered after the service. Children's Sunday school is located on the third floor of the CE building. Adult Sunday school is located in Von Maur Hall. Please ask a worship host if you need assistance locating these spaces.



Our Session (church council) has adopted a bold vision of creating safe and sacred space for all. We aren't perfect at it, but we are joyfully beginning to live into this new vision. We are an open and

affirming congregation, and a proud member of the Covenant Network of Presbyterians (covnetpres.org). The Session and members of First Pres extend a sincere welcome to all persons regardless of race, nationality, gender, or sexual orientation. This includes an open invitation to membership, the sacraments of baptism and communion, marriage, funerals, memorial services, and service as an officer of the church.



We are a Matthew 25 church in the PC(USA). Matthew 25 congregations identify themselves as working toward one or more of three goals: building congregational vitality, dismantling structural racism, and eradicating systemic poverty.



Bix Liturgy Cookie Reception in Fellowship Hall 10:30 am

On Sunday August 6 at 9:30, step back into the same sanctuary space where Bix Beiderbecke, his brother, Bernie, and sister Mary Louise spent many a musical childhood hour. For nearly 25 years our music ministry has hosted the "official" Bix Liturgy Service co-sponsored by the Bix Beiderbecke Memorial Society and First Presbyterian.

Bix's Mother, Agatha Beiderbecke, was an accomplished pianist and church organist. She recognized her son's perfect pitch and instilled his love of music starting with the piano. When not playing classical piano in their home's parlor on Grand Avenue, Agatha could be found in the newly built 1899 Victorian sanctuary playing the organ of the Presbyterian Church just blocks away from the family home.

Lucky for us, this majestic Romanesque sanctuary built of Marquette stone with magnesium stain exterior and its jewel tone interior has been preserved just as it was when the Beiderbecke family worshiped here. Bix's brother and sister were baptized at First Presbyterian on June 10, 1900 and Leon "Bix" was confirmed as a member in his early teens.

After the Bix Liturgy, the Congregational Development and Fellowship Committee invites you to enjoy cookies and beverages in the same Fellowship Hall where Agatha Beiderbecke was known to share her favorite baked goods at church events. An assortment of Beiderbecke memorabilia will also be on display and (hopefully) CDs of our guest musicians.

Memorial for the Lost

On Saturday, August 12th at 10:00 AM, in partnership with member churches of P.U.N.C.H., we will hold a memorial service for people of the Quad-Cities that have died as a result of gun violence. We will gather on Kirkwood Boulevard, by the church building, to have a Memorial service and install stands bearing tee-shirts with the names and dates of those murdered by gun violence over the past 5 years.

The first Memorial to the Lost was installed on MLK Weekend in January 2013 on the front lawn of the Presbyterian Church of Chestnut of Chestnut Hill in Philadelphia., but due to the amount of gun violence in the Quad Cities, a local organization, P.U.N.C.H., adopted the project. Each week, the t-shirts will travel to a different church, giving victims and their families a voice.

"If we don't call attention to it because it doesn't happen to us, in our family, it goes unnoticed," says Third Missionary Pastor Rogers Kirk.

Pastor Pilar Establishes New Latino Ministry in Quad-Cities

Less than a year after bringing his family from Guatemala as refugees to the U.S., Rev. Jose Pilar Alvarez Cabrera has a new pastoral position! Pilar has been commissioned by the Iowa/Illinois synods of the ELCA (Lutheran) denomination to develop an outreach to the Hispanic population of the Quad-Cities, with the goal of participating in different mission initiatives in the Quad-Cities.

As a centerpiece to the new mission, Pilar has begun leading weekly services. At 1:00 each Sunday afternoon, he leads the service at Trinity Lutheran, Moline, 1330 13th Street. At 5:00 each Sunday, he leads the service at St. Mark Lutheran Church, Davenport, 2383 W. 3rd St. Both services are primarily in Spanish but non-Spanish speaking members would be more than welcome as a way to support both Pilar and the new ministry.

The relationship between First Pres and Pastor Pilar originated in 2006, when a joint mission team from FPC and Grace Lutheran churches visited ILUGUA, the church in La Trementina, Guatemala, led by Pilar and his brother Eduardo. Many subsequent visits have strengthened the bond and provided support for ILUGUA's outreach programs to the indigenous population of the region. Pastor Eduardo continues to lead this ministry since Pilar's departure.

August 10: Green Book, rated PG-13

Green Book is a 2018 American biographical comedy-drama film directed by Peter Farrelly. Set in 1962, the film is inspired by the true story of a tour of the Deep South by African American classical and jazz pianist Don Shirley and Italian American bouncer Frank "Tony Lip" Vallelonga who served as Shirley's driver and bodyguard. The film was written by Farrelly, Brian Hayes Currie and Vallelonga's son, Nick Vallelonga, based on interviews with his father and Shirley, as well as letters his father wrote to his mother. The film is named after The Negro Motorist Green Book, a mid-20th century guidebook for African American travelers written by Victor Hugo Green.



August 17: Selma, rated PG-13

Selma is a 2014 historical drama film based on the 1965 Selma to Montgomery voting rights marches led by James Bevel, Hosea Williams, Martin Luther King Jr., and John Lewis. The film stars actors David Oyelowo as King, Tom Wilkinson as President Lyndon B. Johnson, Tim Roth as George Wallace, Carmen Ejogo as Coretta Scott King, and Common as Bevel.



August 24: Hidden Figures, rated PG

Hidden Figures is a 2016 American biographical drama film loosely based on the non-fiction book of the same name by Margot Lee Shetterly about black female mathematicians who worked at the National Aeronautics and Space Administration (NASA) during the Space Race.



August 31: The Butler, rated PG-13

The Butler is a 2013 American historical drama film directed and co-produced by Lee Daniels. It is inspired by Wil Haygood's Washington Post article "A Butler Well Served by This Election." Loosely based on the real life of Eugene Allen, who worked in the White House for decades, the film stars Forest Whitaker as Cecil Gaines, an African-American who is a witness of notable political and social events of the 20th century during his 34-year tenure serving as a White House butler.
