

It is our way of showing people that we, as a church community, love them and care for them.

the morning, afternoon, or all day (8:30 AM-3 PM). Thank you for your support!






These past few months have been full of learning, fun, and fellowship! In Sunday School, our youth and children have read from Genesis, Ex-

What are Restricted and Custodial Funds... and how may we use them?



First Presbyterian Church Davenport owes a debt of gratitude to those who preceded us. They taught us their faith and passed on their traditions; they provided our worship and fellowship spaces. But did you know that they also blessed us financially by establishing funds for various purposes? Examples include mission areas for youth, aged members, our neighbors; Christian Education; music programs; and building maintenance. Our faith "ancestors" provided financial resources to be used to support many of our current projects and programs.

At FPC, we call these funds "Restricted" and "Custodial" funds. They are the church's equivalent to one's personal savings for renovating one's kitchen or for a child's education. Restricted funds tend to be longer-term and more permanent in nature. They were

usually created from members' legacy gifts. Often, only the interest earned on a Restricted fund may be spent. On the other hand, Custodial funds have a shorter-term with a designated focus to support a project or activity often within a year or two of the donations. They are sometimes created for an upcoming activity, like a mission trip. Typically, they may be spent in their entirety.

These financial gifts were meant to be utilized in accordance with each fund's designated purpose. Recently, the Finance Committee has researched church records to better understand two Restricted funds in particular: the Memorial Fund and the Sesquicentennial Fund. We want to know who created them, what their stated purpose is, any restrictions on their use and - if those restrictions can be altered - who may make changes and how. Use of these funds must comply with the original purpose, but guidelines for their use may only be changed with approval of Session. In the case of the Memorial Fund, the congregation must also approve any changes.

The Finance Committee is asking the Session to approve changes to the Memorial Fund and the Sesquicentennial Fund that will allow those funds to be used more easily to support the revitalization of our congregation.

Our faith "ancestors" blessed us in many ways and their blessings were meant for our use. The Finance Committee believes that this includes their financial gifts, and we are working to appropriately find ways to use these blessings.

2024 Per Capita - \$42.17 per member



"Per Capita provides the means to strengthen the connections of our work and build lasting relationships to help all Presbyterians share God's love through mission and ministry." PC(USA)

2024 Per Capita is \$42.17 per member. A member is one who has been confirmed or has been welcomed into the congregation by confession of faith, letter of transfer from another congregation, or reaffirmation of faith. If you wish to pre-pay your 2024 Per Capita prior to 12/31/2023, please indicate as such with your payment. You can submit your annual Per Capita by mail or you can pay online.

Per Capita is a fundamental way in which all of the nearly 10,000 congregations and mid councils of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) connect, participate and share in the work of the wider church. Per capita is the primary source of funding for the Office of the General Assembly and is how Presbyterians mutually and equitably share the costs of coming together to discern the Spirit's leading for the future.

- It is how Presbyterians are trained to become better ruling elders, teaching elders and deacons, and ministers.
- It is how Presbyterians are helped to discern God's call in their lives.
- It is how Presbyterians participate in the wider church by serving on General Assembly committees and commissions, regardless of distance or financial resources.
- It is how Presbyterians participate in the life of the Church universal as we commit our selves to work and live in fellowship with "all persons in every nation" (Book of Order, G-4.0101)

All Presbyterians are called to take part in the ecclesiastical and administrative work shared by the whole church though per capita giving. The annual rate is a per-member apportionment that is assessed biennially by the General Assembly. (Book of Order, G-3.0106) All congregations — large and small — are encouraged to participate, either through an annual budget item or through a special direct appeal to their congregations.

Giving Tuesday – November 28, 2023

#GivingTuesday was created in 2012 as a simple idea: a day that encourages people to




do good. Over the past 11 years, this idea has grown into a year-round global movement that inspires hundreds of millions of people to give, collaborate, and cele-

The Foundation of First Presbyterian Church



We worship in a beautiful, historic building with a wonderful, faithful congregation. To accomplish the mission of First Presbyterian Church of Davenport (FPC) year in and year out, many resources are required - - not only time, but money.

The Foundation of First Presbyterian Church of Davenport is a separate entity from FPC, but it exists to lend financial support for the mission and needs of FPC. This financial support is supplemental, or in addition to the Stewardship resources that create the church's General Fund.

Just as most financial assets grow with the years, so gifts to the Foundation may provide benefits to continuing generations. The **Foundation of FPC** is dedicated to increasing support of First Pres. and expanding the work of its mission and programs.

HOW IS THE FOUNDATION OF FPC STRUCTURED?

The Foundation of FPC has two main funds that are managed by the Board of Trustees. Gifts to the **Endowment Fund** are added to the principal of the Endowment Fund. Returns on the investment of the Endowment Fund can be used by FPC. Gifts to the **Unrestricted Fund** are used to assist FPC with unanticipated expenses beyond what is covered by the Stewardship Funds.

There are five church members who serve as Board of Trustees and who interact with New Covenant Trust Company, our investment management company to oversee the performance and growth of *Foundation of FPC* funds. These Trustees answer to the Members of the *Foundation of FPC*. Foundation Members are those individuals who are the currently sitting Elders of FPC, and they operate independently from their Session role.

The **Foundation of FPC** is a 501c3 corporation and operates according to the Iowa Uniform Management of Institutional Funds Act, and is not controlled by the Presbytery, Synod or Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.).

Foundation of FPC gifts that were received years ago from congregation members of past were cultivated and grown and have been used to help with unanticipated FPC expenditures. Some examples of this include:

- Assisted with 2022 staff search and relocation expenses;
- Paid a portion (\$25,000) of the project to repair and protect the historic Lamb Stained Glass Windows in 2022;
- Provided \$40,000 to cover much of FPC's Multimedia Campaign in 2009;
- Supported the Deacon's efforts to relocate a family from Africa to the Quad Cities;
- Enabled the buildout of the Heritage Room & related supplies in the amount of \$50,000;
- Assisted with funding for the 2016 Envisioning 2020 effort, staff search efforts and relocation costs;
- Covered the \$20,321 cost for parking lot improvements in 2017;
- Provided \$100,000 to support the Church's Bridge Builder's Campaign in the mid 1990's for sanctuary renovations and repairs;
- Covered \$165,000 of the \$275,000 to repair the Church roof;

THE NEED FOR FOUNDATION GIVING TO SUPPORT FUTURE GENERATIONS

FPC is not alone in our financial challenges. From Church-Development.com:

"As buildings age and staff salary and benefit expenses creep steadily upward each year, congregations struggle to keep up, frequently finding themselves facing maintenance issues of crisis proportions or making the difficult decision to cut staffing and/or program levels in order to balance this budget. And as government funding for social programs decreases, more churches are stepping in to provide new services to their communities."

The need to increase participation in *Foundation of FPC* giving is more crucial than ever. To truly keep up with the resources required to support the church building into the future, we need to grow *Foundation of FPC* funds today.

Please discuss with your financial/tax advisor to determine if this option is available and right for you. Please notify the Finance Office for up-to-date instructions on how to process RMD donations and to ensure you receive full contribution credit.
- Gifting Stock Please discuss with your financial/tax advisor to determine if this option is available and right for you. When stock is gifted to the church, please notify the Finance Office to receive up-to-date instructions on how to process the donation to FPC and to ensure you receive full contribution credit.
